Like a mountain stream newly fed by a melting blizzard, our HYS Recreational Program saw a torrential increase in players this Spring. Overall, our Rec Program has grown by 34%. Some age groups much more: our U9/10B age group is up 62%, U11B up 58%, U7/8B up 46%, our U4/5s up 41% and our U12B up 91%!

- Most memorable coaching moment: 2019 U19 All-Star Tournament, the team was down to 11 boys, exhausted, had to play down because boys were cramping up. By the third game we had no shot at the title, I asked the boys who were all in various forms of pain if they wanted to skip the final game which would be in intense heat. Boys all said "no!" because they wanted to play one last time with their teammate, Matthew, who was about to leave for college and with whom they had all played since U7. Other teams looking on cheered our boys' valiant effort because they got where we were coming from.
- Favorite coaching sayings: "Carpe Diem" & "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."
